## **TITUS:** Godly Leadership for the Church (Titus 1:1-16; 1 Peter 5:1-4)

Context of Titus: Titus sent to Crete to bring leadership order to local churches: Office & Lay

# <u>Main Point:</u> In reflection of a holy, relational, and ordered God-head, the Lord has commanded that His Church be organized and led by Godly, spirit-filled men who act as lead servants to that body.

- Two main ideas in these verses:
- God called leaders within the local church that are lead servants to bless, disciple, & care/nurture
- God's calling to those leaders is to deal w/division, dissention, corruption, & heresy w/in church **READ Titus 1:1-16**

Paul, a bond-servant of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ, <sup>[a]</sup>for the faith of those chosen of God and the knowledge of the truth which is according to godliness, <sup>2</sup> in the hope of eternal life, which God, who cannot lie, promised <sup>[b]</sup>long ages ago, <sup>3</sup> but at the proper time revealed His word in the proclamation with which I was entrusted according to the commandment of God our Savior; <sup>4</sup> To Titus, my true <sup>[c]</sup>son <sup>[d]</sup>in a common faith: Grace and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Savior. **\*Qualifications of Elders:** 

<sup>5</sup> For this reason I left you in Crete, that you would <u>set in order</u> what remains [in the church] and appoint **elders** in every city as I directed you, <sup>6</sup> *namely*, if any man is beyond reproach, the husband of one wife, having children who believe, not accused of indecent behavior or rebellion. <sup>7</sup> For the **overseer** [*episcopos*/bishop] must be beyond reproach as God's steward, not self-willed, not quick-tempered, not overindulging in wine, not [f] a bully, not greedy for money, <sup>8</sup> but hospitable, loving what is good, self-controlled, righteous, holy,

disciplined,<sup>9</sup> holding firmly the faithful word which is in accordance with the teaching, so that he will be able both to <sup>[g]</sup>exhort in sound doctrine and to refute those who contradict *it*. **\*Leaders who confront problems within the church:** 

<sup>10</sup> For there are many rebellious people, empty talkers and deceivers, especially those of the circumcision,<sup>11</sup> who must be silenced because they are upsetting whole families, teaching things they should not *teach* for the sake of <sup>[h]</sup>dishonest gain. <sup>12</sup> One of them, a prophet of their own, said, "Cretans are always liars, evil beasts, lazy gluttons." <sup>13</sup> This testimony is true. For this reason reprimand them severely so that they may be sound in the faith, <sup>14</sup> not paying attention to Jewish myths and commandments of men who turn away from the truth. <sup>15</sup> To the pure, all things are pure; but to those who are defiled and unbelieving, nothing is pure, but both their mind and their conscience are defiled. <sup>16</sup> They profess to know God, but by *their* deeds they deny *Him*, being detestable and disobedient and worthless for any good deed.

**God is a God of <u>order</u>**; He has organized every living thing on the earth. Why would he want His Church to be any different? Within and *for* the **church**, <u>God chooses leaders of men to lead</u> <u>and serve men & their families, and their community with gospel and glory of God</u>.

#### Order in the church: Why are we an elder-led, congregationally affirmed church?

- 1. Pastor-led church (senior pastor has all the authority)
- 2. <u>Staff</u>-led church (Senior pastor and staff have all the authority)
- 3. Deacon-led church (Deacons have all the authority)
- 4. Committee-led church (where various committees lead all aspects of the church)
- 5. <u>**Congregational**</u>-led church (where the church body has all the authority of the ch.)

6. <u>Hierarchical</u>-led church (where a denomination has a governing board outside of that local church and has all the authority A. Anglican, Episcopal, Catholic model
=diocese/parish: Bishops, archbishops, cardinals (curia) -led by Pope/Catholic Church
B. Methodist/Lutheran: Districts; Annual Conference; Council of Bishops, General Conf. Or Synods in Lutheran Churches led by area Bishops

**C**. Presbyterian/Reformed: Sessions, Presbyteries, Synods, & General Assembly

7. <u>Elder</u>-led Church (local elders within each church chosen from among congregation/vote) \*\*\*\*We at the WELL are an Elder-led Church; = <u>Elder-Led, Congregationally Affirmed</u>

(The congregation both nominates, and votes to affirm elders.) Ch. also votes on major issues.

1-God commanded leaders to **oversee** the local church within a local city/community

2-Those leaders have a high calling and must be **<u>qualified</u>**/tested according to Scripture 3-Those leaders have a specific responsibility to the church: **Lead, Feed, Care for, Protect** 

4-Those leaders are to identify, raise up, train, and <u>**empower</u>** other leaders/servants within the church to minister the "One-Anothers" to the church and community (Eph. 4:11-15)</u>

**22 Elder Qualifications: (Titus 1:5-9; 1 Tim. 1:1-7; \*1Peter 5:1-5) = <u>Elder/Pastor/Overseer</u> (1. <u>Men</u>; 2. <u>Called by God</u> (vs. 3); 3. <u>Appointed by other elders</u>; 4. <u>Meet 22 biblical requirements</u>): 'beyond reproach (2x) as God's steward,** 

-the husband of **one wife** (one-woman man); divorce may not exclude = dep. on circumstance -having children who believe (children who are under control with all dignity)

not accused of indecent behavior (not on the sex-offenders registry)

not accused of rebellion (not a leader in a church split, divisive, causes dissension)

-not self-willed (=spirit-led, not a bulldozer, not bent on only having his way)

-not quick-tempered (patient, gracious, steady)

not overindulging in wine (never gets drunk; knows when to say no; disciplined)

not a bully (not combative, not contentious)

-not greedy for money (charitable, generous)

-not a new convert (shown spiritual growth, spiritual wisdom, been a long time disciple) -IS hospitable (truly welcoming: open heart, open hands, open home)

-IS loving what is good (joy in his heart overflows from Lord's goodness & it shows in decisions) -IS self-controlled (temperate)

-IS righteous and holy (truly loves the Lord; transformed life)

-IS disciplined (spiritual disciplines: In the Word; in prayer; witnessing; tithing; serving)

-IS gentle (gracious)

-IS respectable

-IS managing his household well (wife is well-loved and nurtured; not in debt; not in chaos) -IS in good reputation among community (neighbors, workplace)

-IS skillful in teaching (apt/able to teach God's Word b/c knows & loves God's Word)

-IS holding firmly the faithful word which is in accordance with the teaching (sound doctrine)

=In order to: A. <u>exhort (</u>encourage; demonstrate) in sound doctrine and

B. refute those who contradict sound doctrine.

#### C. = leading the church to become God's church in all ways scripturally

**\*Do you know someone like this?** Where are they serving/leading?

\*Are you someone like this? Do you aspire to be? =Spiritually mature in your walk

\*These men described here *are* leading this church <u>now</u>: 7 elders. & Aspire to these qualifications

#### These Leaders are not only called to Lead, Feed, to Care for (nurture the flock), but ... these leaders <u>are also called to protect</u> the flock: = confront problems within the church:

<sup>10</sup> For there are many rebellious people, empty talkers and deceivers, especially those of the circumcision [Jewish believers/those with Jewish background who are seekers],<sup>11</sup> who must be silenced because they are upsetting whole families, teaching things they should not *teach* for the sake of dishonest gain [reputation, power, position, monetary gain?]. <sup>12</sup> One of them, a prophet of their own, said, "Cretans are always liars, evil beasts, lazy gluttons." <sup>13</sup> This testimony is true. For this reason reprimand them severely so that they may be sound in the faith, <sup>14</sup> not paying attention to Jewish myths and commandments of men who turn away from the truth. <sup>15</sup> To the pure, all things are pure; but to those who are defiled and unbelieving, nothing is pure, but both their mind and their conscience are defiled. <sup>16</sup> **They profess to know God, but by** *their* **<b>deeds they deny** *Him*, being detestable and disobedient and worthless for any good deed. (God is NOT looking for religious people; He wants to transform hearts/lives)

-Protecting the flock is a form of discipleship based in love: we protect those we love/imp. to us

- -Protection is a <u>physical</u> ministry: We are called to defend the weak, to support the vulnerable from predators, the wicked, lies, those bring dissension, those who are divisive, & disunifiers
- -Protection is also a spiritual ministry: Protect against false doctrine, errant theology
- -Protection in the local church takes on the form of teaching, training, rebuking, correction, and church discipline as needed based on Matthew 18. Based in love & w/ goal of restoration!!
