ROMANS: TRANSFORMED BY GRACE

(Romans 5:18-21 & 6:1-5)

Romans Theme: "Righteousness" = is God's way 4 us to be right relationship w/ God, others, creation (ur own vs. grace)

- Ch 1. Gentile sins (Open rebellion against God & His holy nature) = Gentiles w/o Ch. = unrighteous
- Ch. 2 Jewish sins (Hidden sins; pride; judgmentalism) = Jews w/o Christ=unrig/No partiality w God
- Ch. 3 Paul answers key questions on Salvation: How are we saved? How saved in OT? Why J. die?
- Ch. 4 Paul argues that Salvation is by FAITH and not by our own works of the Law
- Ch. 5 Paul describes what is original sin & why salvation is necessary if we are depraved sinners
- Ch. 6: Paul begins the **Practical** lesson of **HOW DO WE DEFEAT SIN HABITS IN OUR LIVES?**
- -Paul is helping us realize that the practical steps to DEFEATING SIN HABITS in our lives is to really understand 1) what has happened to us when we were saved/transformed; 2) who we have now become as Believers in Christ; 3) what sin-crushing power is readily available to us; 4) who is with us every step of the way in life & in temptation; and 5) what are we called to do until we go to heaven.

MAIN POINT: As Believers who are walking in new life, we are to remember our death to our old life -and how we were rescued. Especially as we struggle with temptation and sin, we help ourselves by remembering what Christ saved us from – what He saved us out of (slavery to sin and imminent destruction, decay, and death) – and what He saved us into (new life and victory over sin and death).

Read Romans 5:18-21 AND 6:1-5

Vs. 18: So then, as through one offense [Adam's sin & rebellion] the result was condemnation to all mankind, so also through one act of righteousness [Jesus' substitutionary atonement on the cross] the result was justification of life to all mankind. ¹⁹ For as through the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so also through the obedience of the One [Jesus] the many will be made righteous. ²⁰ The Law [O.T. Mosaic Law] came in so that the offense would increase [God was specific in how mankind was rebellious in their sin against Gid and each other]; but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more, ²¹ so that, as sin reigned in death, so also grace would reign through righteousness to eternal life *through* Jesus Christ our Lord. *-We need to REVIEW our theology before we get to APPLICATION of it

- A. Mankind is born spiritually <u>dead</u> [still born] = Sinful (1) in <u>Adam</u> (IMPUTATION) (2) by <u>nature</u> (INHERENT sin); and (3) by <u>choice</u> (WILLFUL Sin = <u>Guilty</u> before God)
 - -Sin of Commission (doing what we ought not) Transgression of LAW; breaking Covenant
 - **-Sin of <u>Omission</u>** (not doing what we should) (Deut. 27:26; Jas. 2:10-11; Prov. 6:16-19; Jn. 19:11; Mt. 11:20-24; Lk. 12:47-48)
- B. Our inherent sin means we are <u>DEPRAVED</u> (<u>empty</u> of God, goodness, or own righteousness)
 Results of Total Depravity: Complete corruption of our moral & spiritual nature;
 -Rom. 3:10-12 "There is NO righteous person, not even one. There is no one who
 - understands; there is NO righteous person, not even one. There is no one who understands; there is NO one who seeks God; they have all turned aside and have all become corrupt (depraved); there is no one who does good, not even one"
- C. The punishment of sin: (Spiritual <u>Death</u>; Physical Death; & <u>Eternal</u> Death)

REVIEW: How Bad is the BAD NEWS? The Good News of gospel needs context: How bad?

- 1. All men without respect of condition or class are sinners before God (Rom. 3:9, 10, 22, 23) There may be a difference in the degree, but not in the fact of sin. All people, Jew and Gentile, have missed the mark, and failed to attain to God's standard. There is none righteous.
- 2. This universal sinful condition is vitally connected with Adam's sin (Rom. 5:12-21) All men were *in* Adam when he sinned, so *IN* him, we sinned. This is the principle of the covenant unity of the race, Adam as our Federal/covenant head. = "In Adam all die."
- 3. In sin, the whole world rests under condemnation and wrath (Rom. 3:19; Gal. 3:10; Eph. 2:3) The law of God demands a perfect obedience. The wrath of God abides on all not vitally & spiritually united by faith to Jesus Christ (John 3:18; 36).
- 4. The whole race of men is in helpless captivity to sin and Satan (John 8:31–36; Eph. 2:3)
- 5. The entire nature of man—mentally, morally, spiritually, physically, is affected by sin.
 - -Our understanding is darkened (Eph. 4:18; 1 Cor. 2:14);
 - -Our heart is only & ever deceitful and wicked (Jer. 17:9-10);
 - -Our mind and conscience are defiled (Gen. 6:5; Titus 1:15);
 - -We cannot meet the requirements of God's holiness on our own (Rom. 3:10)
 - -We are totally dependent upon God for salvation and transformation (Eph. 2:8-10).

BUT... Every negative influence that Adam passed on to humanity, Christ overcame! Through Jesus' death as our substitute on the cross, a repentant sinner receives new life In Him: ****GOOD NEWS is even Better: Jesus saves sinners like you and me!

Imputation Vs. Impartation: Christ Imputes His righteousness upon us - declaring us no longer guilty, sinful, BUT now righteous (completely/eternally justified before holy God) -And then Christ **Imparts** His righteousness to us through the gift if the Holy Spirit who then works daily IN us to sanctify and make us righteous – growing us toward sp. maturity in Him.

Here, Paul begins the **Practical** lesson of **HOW DO WE DEFEAT SIN HABITS IN OUR LIVES?**

- -Do you have a pet sin? A Hidden sin? No one knows about? Want to stop it, but keep going back to it, over and over? Indulgence in Alcohol? Pornography? Lies? Adultery? Stealing? Cheating?
- *-In Chapter 6, Paul begins arguing against non-believers and Believers who would use the argument (mockingly) that "since we are saved by grace & Not our own works" - it stands to reason that the more we sin, the more God is glorified by giving us more and more grace. Vs. 5:20 but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more,
- **6 Vs. 1:** What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin so that grace may increase?
- This is an outrage Vs. 2: Far from it! How shall we who died to sin still live in it?
- -to conflate willful sinning and disobedience against God as somehow something good.
- -Is. 5:20 "Woe to those who call evil good and good evil"
- -For the Unbeliever, Paul is arguing that Jesus came to destroy evil, not to tempt us with it.
- -For the Believer, Paul argues against Antinomianism =a twisted argument by those wanting sin
- -ANTINOMIANISM: Choosing to reject biblical obedience to moral law as legalism:
- "I'm forgiven anyway" "God is too gracious to judge me" "Christ has already paid the price for this sin, so there is no penalty" "Obeying the law in scripture is antiquated for the Christian, therefore I can live freely and do what I feel is right" "No reason to forsake sin because in Christ all sin is forgiven." "committing lesser sins prevents me from commiting greater sins"
- *Spiritual danger = License/licentiousness *What is Paul's response to the question of sin/grace?
- 6 Vs. 1: What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin so that grace may increase? Vs. 2: Far from it! How shall we who died to sin still live in it?

-Paul is asking what does life have to do with death? Light with darkness? If as Christians we have been raised from spiritual death to life, why would we keep hanging around the graveyard?

If we have been adopted off the street, given a loving home, a clean/warm bed, three nourishing meals a day, and unconditional love – why would you sneak out at night & go back to fighting for scraps to eat in the garbage dump with the rats?

- =Returning to the scene of crime (where you died and were rescued to life), =enjoying death 🕾
- -If our identity has changed (new creatures) IN CHRIST, then what happened to us at
- conversion, who we are, what we do, & where we are headed <u>all changes</u>. **=diff. desires/needs**
- -Salvation was not simply a transaction, but a TRANSFORMATION (death to life)
- *This is the theme of Chapter six: <u>Died to Sin</u> = Old life, old self, old desires, old man/<u>corpse</u> **Vs. 2:** Far from it! <u>How shall we who died to sin still live in [sin]?</u>

Paul is helping us realize that the FIRST practical step to DEFEATING SIN HABITS in our lives is to really understand 1) what actually happened to us when we were saved/transformed

- -We were dead in our own sin-depraved existence (unable to seek God or do good)
- -Jesus sought us, died for us, the Holy Spirit regenerated our dead hearts to life -gave faith -As He rescued us from death and gave us NEW LIFE, <u>we died to our old life</u>, our past life.
- -The reality of our spiritual death is not fancy, made up words/christianese. Not just symbol *Our Radical conversion/transformation is spiritual is Spiritual/physical/ment. now & in Heaven will be the most REAL reality ever in the universe. FACTS. Saved/Not. Preg/not
- -You were dead spiritually. Made alive by Christ spiritually = & DIED to your old life.
- -Col. 3:3 For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God.
- -Col. 2:20 If you have died with Christ to the elementary principles of the world, why, as if you were living in the world, do you submit yourself to worldly decrees,
- -2 Cor. 5:17 Therefore if anyone is in Christ, *this person is* a new [a] creation/creature; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come.
- -2 Cor. 5:14 "For the love of Christ controls us, having concluded this, that one died for all, therefore all died"

Why is death such a big deal? Biblical Paradox: Divine reality: Through death= life

- -Jn 12:24 "unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit." There is NO salvation unless sinless Jesus died in our place =Death/LIFE
- **-AND** Unless we die to our natural selves, we cannot live spiritually. Unless we die to our flesh and are born-again to new life, we remain spiritually dead and helplessly shackled to our sin and death = NO HOPE. No Power. Just death.
- **-Rom 6:7-8** "The one who has died is freed from sin.⁸ Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him,"
- -What happens at salvation is that through the death of Christ, Jesus defeats sin and death forever; therefore in Jesus' rescue of our lives from spiritual death, He grants us by His grace victory over sin and death. We are TRANSFORMED by His blood from death and spiritual depravity, being slaves to sin and death TO being raised to new life as a new creature, with a new identity, and a new hope, and a new resurrection power living within us through the Holy Spirit who then gives us NEW desires, a new perspective, and new (renewed mind) so we can know what we believe about God, His Word, and Truth and live in it!! To pursue HIM/please Him -So why would we want to go back and hang around the graveyard of sins, lies, defeat, destruction, decay, and death?
- -2 Tim. 2:11 This is a trustworthy saying: If we died with Him, we will also live with Him;

Vs. 3: Or do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus have been baptized into His death? **Vs. 4:** Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too may walk in newness of life. **Vs. 5:** For if we have become [b] united with *Him* in the likeness of His death, certainly we shall also be [c] in the likeness of His resurrection,

APPLICATION – what does this mean for my life?

- 1. We have to check our own heart and attitude- that as a believer it's ok to sin. To rebel against God and His Word. To willfully and knowingly reject what is explicit in the Bible as far as moral law and standards for holiness (Christlikeness). We have been lying to ourselves that this behavior is ok for the Christian. -As a Believer, do you feel conviction when you sin?
- **2.** We have to reject the lie the Satan throws at us in temptation- that little sins don't count for much. *Or that no one will find out*. Or that as long as you aren't harming anyone, it's ok to do as you please. -BUT, God knows. Our sin is against a holy God who sees and knows all!
 - We lie to ourselves when we give ourselves a pass to sin as we see fit.
 - -As a Believer, do you regularly remind yourself of what is TRUE, for always & forever?
- =God's Word is true, relevant to your life, and it is sufficient to teach you, rebuke you, correct you and train you in Righteousness that you would be "complete" / mature in Christ.
- **3.** We must remember what it means to be UNITED/ONE with Jesus in every part of our life and journey on this earth; especially when we struggle, are tempted, experience loss & suffer. To be united with Him in death changes how we see our old lifestyle, our old choices, our old sinful habits, and attitudes/perspectives of the world and our self-centered, medriven life.
 - -As a Believer, do you pursue daily your relationship with Jesus (since you are already ONE with Him), asking the Holy Spirit to help you please the Lord in every aspect of your life?
